

Seljefløyte springar

A seljefløyte is a Norwegian willow-flute, basically a whistle with no fingerholes that only plays on the natural harmonic series, and a springar is a kind of Norwegian dance. The second staff indicates the traditional pulse for this sort of tune. The player would normally tap their foot to this rhythm.
